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

Linda Scott - LGNSW President - Update

Commitment Letters to be sent to LGNSW that they will follow up for you, so that governments are following up on their promises.

Water - drought impact at the top of Agenda.

Have been fighting hard for increased water allocations and funds.

\$170 m for CBD and Airport upgrades.

Lobbying for an additional \$1 million for regional Councils from the Federal Government.

FAGS:

Freeze not lifted - 13% reduction

Would like them increased to 1%

Working with ALGA on a fairer share campaign

IPART reports:

Have been released - review on rates report - submissions now open

Send through any recommendations that you have that you would like the Government to adopt.

Ensuring Councils sustainability.

Emergency Services Levy:

Asking Government to cover costs for first year.

Pass Mayoral Minute about ESL.

Roads:

\$1 billion in funding announced.

\$25 million for roads and timber bridges year 1.

\$373 m road safety - targeting high risk areas.

Projects now done on a needs basis - Council's now can't apply.

Roy Butler - Member for Barwon

Securing future infrastructure the time is now – more money in coffers.

Ministerial visits to the area are 400% higher than after the election in 2015.

Declining populations are a concern in rural areas.

Rates Relief - Media Release sent out this morning - ie reducing LSS Fees, has the outcome of the money staying in the local area - keep businesses afloat - keep cash in people's pockets.

Questions on notice to Parliament – have an answer within a specific timeframe.

Trying to get an inquiry into the Murray Darling Basin.

Can send the 10 point management strategy for water - will send to Leigh for distribution.

Murray Wood - Regional NSW Investment Coordinator

Targeted approach on key strength areas.

Focusing on special activation industries.

Looking at growing industries such as hydrogen for energy production.

If you have any Council success stories send them through.

Looking at creating a website back channel specific for Councils.

Looking at ways to unblock impediments to investments to allow them to progress.

Regional Investment Attraction Packages are available – they help with grants, there are also relocation grants available up to \$10,000 under the Regional Skills Relocation Program.

MORNING TEA BREAK

PRESENTATION SUMMARIES (Continued)

Adam Marshall - Minister for Agriculture and Western NSW

Western portfolio has been reinstated – wasn't in between 2015-2019 – more staff will be recruited – one will be based in Bourke, Broken Hill and hopefully in Cobar.

Election commitments – reclassification of rural roads – Paul Toole will be making an announcement on the taskforce – all roads classifications will happen at once – suggested to be pro-active.

Elections can be brutal, wants to reassure that all of the programs, funds and support will continue to roll on.

Drought recovery planning with Commonwealth and State Departments – cooperation and working together.

Discussions were held on weirs, building new ones, ownership and gifting old ones back.

Local Government responsibility - discussions on depreciation - suggested that we invite the Local Government Minister to the next meeting.

Minister Marshall has suggested that we write to him with the date of the next meeting and who we would like there and he will arrange it and follow up.

Paul Smith - NSW Police Barrier District

Local training facility – active arm training facility – being established in Broken Hill as opposed to travelling to Newcastle. One will also be set up in Dubbo in the future – will tie in with Rural Fire Services – will be a full time facility, with full time staff.

1,500 police have been announced for NSW.

Apology from Greg Moore.

To get extra policing numbers you can lobby for it, you need the evidence to support your application, get your residents to start reporting minor incidents and crimes, use CrimeStoppers – to ensure that everything is recorded correctly.

How do you ensure that they are properly equipped – speeding and drug testing – proposal in place to get hand held radars, just trying to push through.

Drug dog units at Dubbo and Wagga - probably won't get one at Broken Hill.

Ashley Albury - Department Premier and Cabinet

Infrastructure has undertaken an organisation change (will provide the new organisational chart when they can be released).

It will be a lot easier having everyone working under the one banner.

Joint Organisations:

Have been one of the biggest issues, they now all have their money and there will be continued regional coordination.

Helen Dalton - Member for Murray

Water - 10 Point Plan - opens up the avenue with Minister Pavey to make a change. Water Management and Water quality - these are serious issues - need the \$2 million to complete research to be undertaken in relation to blue green algae and motor neuron disease.

Mobile blackspots – there are a number of areas that have been identified – letter will be sent to Councils.

Education – pre-school kids not attending as parents can't get them to school – we are at times disadvantaged in the bush. Promoting school leaders – trying to get students particularly girls into parliament.

Health – we need to be systematically built back up again – short of Doctors right through. Rural Adversity Program – none in the Murray – 100% drought across the state. Overview of health services system.

We need to encourage development – VIC it seems to be easier.

Housing – a big issue – we contribute to the GDB.

Sister City Relationships - help with compliance, start one with a richer Council if you can.

State imposed laws - that limit production or development.

In the Murray Electorate – she is going to run a grant writing workshop – to build capacity to help community groups to get their fair share.

Mark Forbes - FSWJO

Formed in July 2018, didn't become active until 3 January 2019.

JO's aren't ROC's.

New business models and thinking.

State Government see an opportunity to work with Local Governments.

Transport – tendering for a transport analysis – tourism, freight, social and community focused – strong evidence base for sealing roads.

Stephan Heidenreich - NSW Environment

Undertaking a major project to update all instruments.

All instrument sites are run by volunteers, the sites are run by solar.

Looking at a climate/ air quality monitoring network.

Information is live on their website.

There is a monthly report that you can subscribe too.

We are at a bad starting point for dust storms moving into spring, we need decent rain fall to prevent these.

The dust ions are way past the 2009 point.

Predicted that we are going to get a lot of dust storms in the coming month.

Solution - land management.

Andrew - Western LLS

Submitted an application on behalf of the Western Division on pest management (wild dogs). Federal funded project.

Working on a group model level.

All 5 actions submitted and approved: 1. Extension Project – 12 months – smaller consultation and developing pest plans or an expo;

- 2. Support seasonal batting programs;
- 3. Infrastructure for the Eastern side want to establish in Bourke;
- 4. Large scale monitoring program.
- 5. Trapping component- professional trappers.


